Course objective: This is an online and field-based course. Online lessons are designed to improve your ability to accurately identify common songbird and songbird-like (e.g., woodpeckers) bird species encountered throughout New Hampshire. Field trips to various forest, shrubland, field, wetland, and suburban habitats will teach you how to identify any bird species we encounter during each trip. Through a combination of online and field instruction, you will gain a better understanding of the habitats where you can expect to encounter each bird species and the specific things you can do on your land to attract and benefit birds.

Specific learning outcomes

By completing the online lessons and participating in field trips, you will improve your ability to:

- Identify common bird species based on species-specific characteristics of size & shape, plumage color patterns, songs & calls, habitat, behavior, and seasonal geographic range.
- Predict what bird species will occur in different habitats.
- Identify things you can do on your land to attract and benefit a variety of bird species.

Who is this course for?

Anyone interested in improving their ability to identify birds by sight & sound and in learning more about bird ecology and the habitats birds require. This class is appropriate for beginners with little or no previous birding experience and for experienced birders who want to sharpen their birding skills and learn more about bird ecology and habitats. Many students of this course enroll again to continue practicing and improving their birding skills!

Prerequisites for getting the *most* out of this course:

- Interest in improving your ability to identify birds by sight and sound.
- Commitment to complete weekly online lessons that average from 1 to 2.5 hours each week.
- Commitment to practice identifying birds by sight & sound as often as possible during the course.
- Participating in birding field trips offered as part of this class or by other birding groups, as frequently as your schedule allows.

Required course equipment:

- Peterson Field Guide to Birds of Eastern and Central North America 7th edition (2020)*
- Binoculars*
- Outdoor clothing appropriate for standing and slow walking over terrain indicated for each field trip, water & food necessary to sustain you through the entire length of each trip, insect/tick repellent, and sunscreen as needed.

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COURSE FORMAT & EXPECTATIONS

This course includes a combination of online-lessons and optional field trips designed to provide you with the most effective methods for identifying songbirds and songbird-like birds you are likely to encounter in New Hampshire.

ONLINE LESSONS

- Online lessons include a combination of audio and video lessons that will be e-mailed to you at the beginning of each week of the course beginning March 8, 2025.
- There is no specific meeting time for online lessons; you complete these lessons on your own schedule. Weekly lessons require 1 to 2.5 hrs/week and are in parts so you don't need to complete them all in one sitting. To get the most out of the class, I encourage you to complete each lesson by the end of the week it is assigned to not fall behind due to the amount of material covered in the course. Birding field trips will regularly review birds introduced in online lessons.
- A total of 50 bird species will be introduced in online lessons (see the *Weekly Online Lesson Schedule* below). Each weekly lesson provides detailed instructions for how to identify 2 to 6 new bird species by sight & sound, as well as the habitat needs and basic ecology of each species.
- Weekly online quizzes include a combination of audio recordings, photos, and videos of birds. Quizzes are designed to help you practice your bird ID skills and identify where additional practice will be most helpful.
- Beginning the week it is introduced, you will have continuous access to the material contained in each online lesson until January 1st, 2026.

COURSE FIELD TRIPS

- Field trips are not required, but you are encouraged to participate in as many as you can.
- Field trips will visit a variety of forest, shrubland, field, wetland, and suburban landscapes. We will visit many properties where habitat management has been conducted specifically to benefit birds. All course trips occur in NH unless noted otherwise.
- Field trips provide an ideal opportunity to practice your learned skills on real birds in their habitat and with an instructor pointing out specific features to look and listen for. Most students who have taken this course report their ability to identify birds increased the most as a result of participating in the field trips.
- During field trips we will look specifically for the bird species covered in online lessons, but we'll discuss tips for how to identify *any* birds we encounter. **We observed over 120 bird species during course field trips in 2024.**
- To help ensure an effective student-to-instructor ratio, field trips are limited to the first 10 to 16 people who register for the trip. Each trip is led by a course instructor and the trip leader is listed for each trip in the trip schedule.
- Each trip has a *Trip Rating* that is based on the difficulty of the terrain we cover during the trip. Trips are rated 1-4 as follows:
 - (1) Stationary trips occur primarily at a fixed location and involve little or no walking during the trip
 - (2) Smooth-walking trips occur on roadways or smooth, wide trails
 - (3) **Uneven-ground or narrow trail** trips require walking on uneven surfaces (e.g., exposed rocks or roots, boardwalks, steep trail sections) or on narrow trails where brushing against vegetation can't be avoided
 - (4) Off-trail trips require some walking through forest, shrubland, or field without a trail.
- You must preregister for every trip you would like to attend. Every student must register individually.

 Due to limited space and high demand for field trips, trips are open to registered course participants only.
 - When you register for the course, you can register for **UP TO FOUR trips** that are scheduled for Trip Weeks 1-6 (April 5 – May 16).
 - In mid-April, you will have the opportunity to register for UP TO FOUR trips scheduled for Trip Weeks 6-12 (May 17-June 28).
- Participating in *any* field trip will expose you to the risk of coming in contact with ticks. If you participate in a trip, please assume that you have picked up ticks and do a thorough tick-check immediately after participating the trip.
- Your course registration fee allows you to participate in course field trips for free but please see the trip cancellation policy below:

TRIP CANCELLATION POLICY

The number of people I can admit into this course is based largely on how many spots are available in trips. Once trips are full I need to close registration and this usually means there are many people who won't be able to participate in the course. Because trips fill up fast, many students who register for the course are not able to participate in as many trips as they would like. To make this course as accessible for as many people as possible, it is important that you only register for trips you know you will be able to attend and arrange your schedule to attend every trip you register for.

- You will be automatically charged a \$15 administration fee for any trip you register for <u>but don't attend</u>.

 This is the policy regardless of when, or the reason why, you cancel or don't attend a trip you registered for. Please check your schedule carefully before registering for any trip.
- Out of courtesy for your fellow students and trip leaders, please plan to attend every trip you register for and be sure to sign the attendance sheet at the beginning of each field trip.

 - You will receive a certificate of completion for every weekly online lesson you complete (lessons range from 1.0 hrs to 3.0 hours per week for a total of 16.5 hrs if you complete all 12 online lessons).
 - You will receive a certificate of completion for every course field trip you attend (course field trips average 2 to 3 hours).
 - o Society of American Foresters (SAF) credits will be assigned for weekly lessons and for each field trip.

Please make plans to register as soon as possible on February 4th. This course usually fills by the end of the first day of registration, so there is a good chance you will not get in if you don't register on the 4th.

- Prior to Feb 4th, review the Weekly Course Field Trip Schedule to find the trips you are interested in.
- When you register for the course, you can register for UP TO FOUR trips that are scheduled for Trip Weeks 1-6 (April 5 May 16)
 - Register for these trips when you register for the course (many trips fill up fast).
 - Beginning mid-April, you will have the opportunity to register for UP TO FOUR trips that are scheduled for Trip Weeks 6-12 (May 17-June 28).
- Be sure to check the Trip Rating of each trip to ensure you are registering for trips that are appropriate for your abilities. Trips are rated 1-4 as follows:
 - (1) Stationary trips occur primarily at a fixed location and involve little or no walking during the trip
 - (2) **Smooth-walking** trips occur on roadways or smooth, wide trails
 - (3) **Uneven-ground or narrow trail** trips require walking on uneven surfaces (e.g., exposed rocks or roots, boardwalks, steep trail sections) or on narrow trails where brushing against vegetation can't be avoided
 - (4) Off-trail trips require some walking through forest, shrubland, or field without a trail.
- Early morning bird trips tend to encounter the greatest abundance and diversity of birds, but trips at any time of the day usually provide plenty of opportunities to observe a variety of bird species.
- Only register for trips you know you will be able to attend; check your calendar carefully before registering for each trip and plan to attend every trip you register for. (See the Trip Cancellation Policy on Page 5 of this document).
